

EMPTY PESTICIDE CONTAINERS A FARMER'S GUIDE TO DOING **THE RIGHT THING**

DO 🗸

• Ensure empty containers are **triple rinsed** according to the <u>CropLife SA</u> <u>protocol</u>.

As much as 2.5% of the total product volume is saved by triple rinsing and decanting into the spray tank.

Make sure **all farmworkers know** how to triple rinse an empty container.

Triple rinse posters are available in 7 languages on the CropLife SA website.

- Ensure triple rinsed containers are **punctured** so that they cannot be used again.
- Arrange for containers to be handed over to a **CropLife SA certified recycler**.

Find a list of recyclers here.

• Only transport triple rinsed containers as they are considered nominally clean.

Triple rinsing removes 99.99% or more of product residue.

Insist on a CropLife SA CoDi Intel Declaration from the recycler when empty containers are handed over.

DON'T 🗙

Do not ever burn or bury pesticide containers.

It is a criminal offence and could result in fines or jail time.

Do not transport containers that are not triple rinsed if you are not licensed to transport dangerous goods.

Only qualified drivers and vehicles with a dangerous goods license may transport these.

• Do not reuse, sell or donate empty containers, even if they are triple rinsed.

It is unlawful.
